On December 2, 2013, North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC) submitted a compliance filing in accordance with the Commission's September 2013 Order.<sup>1</sup> Specifically, the September 2013 Order directed revisions to the NERC Rules of Procedure Appendix 4D, Procedure for Requesting and Receiving Technical Feasibility Exceptions to NERC Critical Infrastructure Protection Standards.<sup>2</sup>

Notice of this filing was issued on December 3, 2013, with protests and interventions due on or before December 23, 2013. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. 18 C.F.R. § 385.214. No protests were filed.

NERC's uncontested filing is accepted pursuant to the relevant authority delegated to the Director, Office of Energy Market Regulation, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307.
