Follow-up Actions in Response to P73 of the March 15 Order

Dear Secretary Bose:

This letter is submitted in response to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“FERC”) or the (“Commission”) Office of Electric Reliability’s (“OER”) letters dated November 26, 2012 to the Western Electricity Coordinating Council (“WECC”) and Texas Reliability Entity (“Texas RE”) regarding the Commission’s plans to conduct a yearly survey to collect data on the effectiveness and efficiency of the Find, Fix, Track and Report (“FFT”) program pursuant to its March 15 Order in the above docket (the “Order”).

OER identified one FFT in its correspondence with WECC and one FFT in its correspondence with Texas RE for inclusion in its annual sample that were originated and processed by NERC as Compliance Enforcement Authority (“CEA”). The FFTs in question relate to issue numbers NCEA201100126 and NCEA200900042. Consequently, NERC is providing the requested data, correspondence, and other supporting information used by NERC staff to evaluate and conclude that these possible violations qualified for FFT treatment. In addition, OER requested evidence that the issue was successfully remediated, and a brief narrative explaining the submitted materials. NERC is providing this information as well.

NERC has worked diligently to collect and provide the information that has been requested in connection with those two FFTs. The data is being submitted to OER via the eFiling mechanism provided on the Commission’s website. In addition to this cover letter, NERC has included a document that describes and identifies the data provided along with the files that contain the specific data requested.

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Request for Confidential Treatment

The attachments to this response include confidential information as defined by the Commission's regulations at 18 C.F.R. Part 388 and orders, as well as NERC Rules of Procedure including the NERC CMEP Appendix 4C to the Rules of Procedure. This includes non-public information and non-public compliance and enforcement files, and may include Registered Entity sensitive business information and confidential information regarding critical energy infrastructure.

In accordance with the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 18 C.F.R. § 388.112, a non-public version of the attachments is being provided under separate cover.

Because these documents are deemed confidential by NERC and registered entities, NERC requests that the confidential, non-public information be provided special treatment in accordance with the above regulation.
