The North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC) [Standards Committee](#) (SC) has two members from each of the ten industry segments. Each SC member is elected by the segment he or she represents. The SC reports to the NERC Board of Trustees and oversees the development of NERC Reliability Standards by performing tasks governed by the [Standard Processes Manual](#), the [Standards Committee Charter](#), and the [SC Work Plan](#).

Any person may nominate any other person to serve on the SC, with the limitation that the nominee must be employed by or an agent of an entity that is registered in that segment of the [Registered Ballot Body](#) (RBB) of the [Standards Balloting and Commenting System](#). The nominee is not required to be the RBB representative from that organization.

Nominations are currently being accepted for each of the ten segments. Election of representatives is governed by the NERC Rules of Procedure, Appendix 3B: [Procedures for Election of Members of the Standards Committee](#).

You may use this form to nominate candidates for segments 1 through 10. You may submit more than one nomination. Please, however, use one form per nomination. You are welcome to nominate yourself.

In particular, David leads the team responsible for SCE's compliance with NERC Reliability Standards across its Generator Owner (GO) and Generator Operator (GOP) functions. David also leads the teams responsible for SCE's compliance with regulations from the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), WECC, NERC, FERC, CFTC, CARB, and other state and Federal regulators.

David has held a variety of roles with SCE, most recently as the Principal of Reliability and Cybersecurity and prior to that as an attorney in the SCE Law Department handling FERC regulatory matters and a variety of business-side positions leading SCE's compliance across its

power procurement, generation, and corporate functions. A licensed attorney, David is also an active member of the Western Interconnection Compliance Forum (WICF) and holds the Certified Information Systems Security Professional (CISSP) and GIAC Information Security Professional certifications.

In addition, David is a sought-after speaker, serving as a frequent guest speaker on technology, energy, and regulatory matters. He is currently a member of the Advisory Board for the Georgetown Cybersecurity Law Institute, a Planning Commissioner for the City of Pasadena, California, Chair Emeritus of the State Bar of California's Committee on Group Insurance Programs, and an active alumni leader of Long Beach City College, the University of Southern California, and the Georgetown University Law Center.
