The North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC) [Standards Committee](#) (SC) has two members from each of the ten industry segments. Each SC member is elected by the segment he or she represents. The SC reports to the NERC Board of Trustees and oversees the development of NERC Reliability Standards by performing tasks governed by the [Standard Processes Manual](#), the [Standards Committee Charter](#), and the [SC Work Plan](#).

Anyone may submit a nomination. To be eligible for nomination, a nominee shall be an employee or agent of an entity registered in the applicable Segment. To allow verification of affiliation, **a nominee must be a registered user in the NERC Registered Ballot Body**. It is not required that the nominee be the same person as the entity’s Registered Ballot Body representative for that Segment. Instructions are provided in [Appendix 3B](#) of the NERC Rules of Procedure – *Procedure for Election of Members of the NERC Standards Committee Procedure*. Completed nomination forms will be posted on the [SC Nominations and Elections webpage](#).

Nominations are currently being accepted for each of the ten segments for two-year terms. In addition, we are seeking nominations for Segments 3, 5, and 7 for one-year terms.

Ms. Flandermeyer is well qualified to represent Segment 6 entities on the Standards Committee. She will bring substantial energy industry experience; understanding gained from FERC, NERC, and RTO stakeholder participation; and a high-level of compliance expertise to the committee.

Energy Industry Experience. Ms. Flandermeyer, gaining several years of finance and accounting experience in the corporate arena, joined KCP&L in 1999. She quickly developed a comprehensive understanding of the energy industry; she held positions in Internal Audit, as a Team Project Manager to implement the SOX framework, and led Strategic Business Planning in Transmission Delivery Operations.

Industry Participation. In 2011, the NERC Board of Directors appointed Ms. Flandermeyer to the NERC Compliance and Certification Committee, on which she continues to serve. Also, she participated in the Reliability Assurance Initiative (RAI) development project and related working groups, the RBRCWG and RBCMEP. Additionally, she had direct involvement in the MRRE and ORC initiatives, RSAW reviews, and associated projects. Currently, she serves as the Vice-Chair of the NERC Standards Committee Process Subcommittee as well as a member of the CIP Modifications Standards Drafting Team (Project 2016-02).

In addition to her involvement at NERC, Ms. Flandermeyer chairs SPP's Regional Compliance Working Group; is actively involved with the North American Transmission Forum (NATF) and a member of NATF's Compliance Practices Group Core team; and sits on EEI's Reliability Executive Advisory Committee.

Compliance Experience. Ms. Flandermeyer's 15-years experience as an auditor provided a strong foundation as she was tasked with establishing multiple programs to address the unique compliance requirements of a diverse set of regulators, including FERC and NERC. In 2009, she accepted the opportunity to lead the team responsible for the company-wide FERC and NERC regulatory compliance and assurance function. In 2015, the position changed to focus on policy and implementation of FERC and NERC compliance obligations in partnership with the company's assurance department's oversight function.

Working for the company's Chief Compliance Officer, Ms. Flandermeyer continues to be primarily focused on regulatory interface work, policy and strategy participation, and enforcement processes. With the anticipated merger of KCP&L and Westar Energy, her responsibilities in the combined company will expand to include BES compliance for areas encompassing close to half of Kansas and a large area of Missouri.

Education and Certifications. Ms. Flandermeyer holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Accountancy from William Jewell College, a Master's Degree in Business Administration from Rockhurst University, and certifications in Risk Management as well as Compliance and Ethics.
