

## Standards Committee Nomination Form

Special Election - Segment 6

The [Standards Committee](#) (SC) has two representatives from each of the ten industry segments. The SC representatives are elected by the segment they represent. The SC reports to the NERC Board of Trustees and oversees the development of NERC Reliability Standards by performing tasks governed by the [Standard Processes Manual](#), the [SC Charter](#), and the [SC Work Plan](#).

Anyone may submit a nomination. To be eligible for nomination, a nominee shall be an employee or agent of an entity registered in the applicable Segment. **To allow verification of affiliation, a nominee must be a registered user in the NERC [Registered Ballot Body](#) (RBB).** It is not required that the nominee be the same person as the entity's Registered Ballot Body representative for that Segment. Instructions are provided in [Appendix 3B](#) of the NERC Rules of Procedure – *Procedure for Election of Members of the NERC Standards Committee Procedure*. Completed nomination forms will be posted on the [SC Nominations and Elections webpage](#).

Nominations are currently being held to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the 2019-2020 term in Segment 6. Election of representatives is governed by the default [Election of Members of the NERC Standards Committee Procedure](#).

As Manager of Reliability Compliance for ACES , Rebecca is responsible for providing project management leadership to ACES members, customers, and internal workgroups, which consist of a combination of Electric cooperatives, Municipal utilities, Public power agencies, Renewable energy providers, Industrial companies, Investor-owned utilities, Banks and hedge funds. These project management activities include: providing advice and guidance, tracking and disseminating NERC standards information, and coordinating activities such as commenting on new and revised standards, developing and hosting technical conferences and webinars and facilitating peer reviews.

Rebecca has 14 years of industry experience, including Corporate Counsel and Compliance Analyst positions at Midcontinent Independent System Operator and a Compliance Analyst role at Indianapolis Power & Light Company, an AES company. Rebecca’s experience with NERC Operations and Planning and Critical Infrastructure Protection standards includes compliance program development, audit preparation, compliance investigations, risk identification, registration and certification, and self-reporting and mitigation plan development.

Rebecca has previously participated on ERO Monitoring Subcommittee of the NERC Compliance and Certification Committee and actively tracks the NERC Planning Committee and NERC Operating Committee. Considering her active involvement with the NERC standards development process, the open Segment 6 representative position would be an ideal opportunity for Rebecca to be even more engaged in the standards development process. Rebecca’s previous experience with entities in other segments, including segments 1 (Transmission Owners), 2 (Regional Transmission Organizations and Independent System

Operators, 3 Load-Serving Entities, and 5 (Electric Generators) will provide her with a broad understanding of how standard development efforts will impact segment 6, but also other segments.
