Comment Period Open for Proposed Revisions to the NERC Rules of Procedure: NERC is proposing revisions to Sections 600 (Personnel Certification) and 900 (Training and Education) of its currently effective Rules of Procedure (ROP). The purpose of these revisions is in response to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's directives issued in the July 19, 2018 Order Approving in Part and Denying in Part Revisions to North American Electric Reliability Corporation Rules of Procedure and Requiring Compliance Filing, 164 FERC ¶ 61,023 (2018) to (i) submit a compliance within 120 days restoring ROP Sections 603, 604, and 605, and (ii) correct typographical errors in proposed Sections 600 and 900. STANDARDS NEWS

NEW Nomination Period Open for Standards Committee Special Election

Registered Ballot Body members and others interested in NERC Reliability Standards are encouraged to submit nominations for industry segment representatives on the Standards Committee (SC). Reliability Standards are mandatory for all bulk power system owners, operators, and users in North America, and the SC's oversight role is therefore increasingly important. The SC consists of two members from each of the ten Industry Segments that make up the Registered Ballot Body. In addition, <u>Appendix 3B</u> of the Rules of Procedure contains special provisions to be used to ensure Canadian representation if at least two of the twenty SC representatives are not Canadian. The SC is elected by industry stakeholders and reports directly to the

NERC Board of Trustees. The SC meets up to twelve times each year, with four face-to-face meetings and the remainder by conference call. SC members who cannot travel to the meetings may participate by conference call. The <u>Standards Committee Charter</u> provides a description of the SC's responsibilities.

There are members representing 10 segments whose term will conclude at the end of December 2018. Therefore, an election will be held to fill the two-year terms (2019–2020) for each of the ten segments. When submitting a nomination form, indicate the segment you are interested in for membership. Any Industry Segment that intends to use a special procedure to elect its SC representatives must provide a copy of its procedure to Linda Jenkins at <u>linda.jenkins@nerc.net</u> by October 9, 2018.

Anyone may submit a nomination. To be eligible for nomination, a nominee shall be an employee or agent of an entity registered in the applicable Segment. To allow verification of affiliation, **a nominee shall be a registered user in the NERC Registered Ballot Body**. It is not required that the nominee be the same person as the entity's Registered Ballot Body representative for that Segment. Instructions are provided in <u>Appendix 3B</u> of the NERC Rules of Procedure – *Procedure for Election of Members of the NERC Standards Committee Procedure*. Completed nomination forms will be posted on the <u>SC Nominations and Elections webpage</u>. A blank nomination form is attached to this email.

Please submit completed SC nomination forms to <u>Linda Jenkins</u> no later than **Tuesday**, **October 9**, **2018**. An election of segment representatives will be conducted shortly after the nominations period is closed.
