| Comment Period Open for Draft Reliability Guideline: The NERC System Planning Impacts from Distributed Energy Resources Working Group (SPIDERWG) developed the draft Reliability Guideline: Bulk Power System Reliability Perspectives on the Adoption of IEEE 1547-2018. The Reliability Guideline provides high-level guidance and BPS reliability perspectives that should be considered during the adoption and implementation of IEEE 1547-2018. Specifically, the guideline focuses on issues pertaining to DER that have been identified by SPIDERWG as potentially having an impact to the BPS. The guidance is intended for state regulatory staffs, Distribution Providers (DPs), Balancing Authorities (BAs), Reliability Coordinators (RCs), and other entities navigating adoption of IEEE 1547-2018 and its requirements. - Segment 4, Transmission Dependent Utilities (TDUs), currently has a vacancy for the 2020–2021 term.
- Segment 7, Large Electricity End Users, currently has a vacancy for the 2020–2021 term.
- Segment 9, Federal, State, and Provincial Regulatory or other Government Entities, currently has a vacancy for the remainder of the 2019–2020 term and 2020–2021 term.

Registered Ballot Body (RBB) members and others interested in NERC Reliability Standards are encouraged to submit nominations for industry segment representatives on the SC. Reliability Standards are mandatory for all bulk power system owners, operators, and users in North America, and the SC's oversight role is therefore increasingly important. The SC consists of two members from each of the ten Industry Segments that make up the RBB. In addition, Appendix 3B of the Rules of Procedure contains special provisions to be used to achieve a balance of representation between the United States and Canada. The SC is elected by industry stakeholders and reports directly to the NERC Board of Trustees. The SC meets up to twelve times each year, with four face-to-face meetings and the remainder by conference call. The <u>Standards Committee Charter</u> provides a description of the SC's responsibilities.

Nominations are being accepted through **February 13, 2020** in preparation for a special election for Segments 4, 7, and 9. Anyone may submit a nomination. To be eligible for nomination, a nominee shall be an employee or agent of an entity belonging in the applicable Segment. To allow verification of affiliation, a nominee must be a registered user in the NERC <u>RBB</u>. It is not required that the nominee be the same person as the entity's RBB representative for the applicable Segment. Instructions are provided in the <u>Election of Members of the NERC Standards Committee</u> <u>Procedure</u> and nomination forms are posted on the <u>Standards Committee Election web page</u>. To submit a nomination, complete the nomination



form and submit to <u>Linda Jenkins</u> no later than **February 13, 2020.** Once received, nominations will be posted on the SC's Nominations and Election web page. The special election will be conducted **February 24, 2020–March 4, 2020.** Election results will be announced shortly after the election closes.

GENERAL COMPLIANCE AND ENFORCEMENT NEWS

NEW Compliance Monitoring and Enforcement Program Annual Report Now Available

This report highlights key ERO Enterprise Compliance Monitoring and Enforcement Program (CMEP) activities that occurred in 2019, provides information and statistics regarding those activities, and identifies the ERO Enterprise's 2020 CMEP priorities. The full report is currently available as **Agenda Item 3** in the <u>Compliance Committee</u> <u>Agenda Package</u> for the <u>February 5 NERC Board of Trustees Meeting</u>.

In 2019, CMEP activities throughout the ERO Enterprise reflected continuing implementation of a risk-based approach that has enabled the ERO Enterprise to focus resources on risks to the reliability of the BPS, risks specific to registered entities, and risks pertaining to serious noncompliance.

In 2020, the ERO Enterprise plans to continue its focus on effective program alignment and harmonization in risk-based compliance monitoring and enforcement. Specific priorities for 2020 include completing and delivering Release 1 of Align, continuing to embed internal control activities within the compliance monitoring program, working as an ERO Enterprise with stakeholder feedback to evaluate compliance monitoring and enforcement processes for efficiency, and harmonizing processes where appropriate.

NEW Align Update and Posted Resources

On January 27, the <u>Align</u> project team hosted a <u>webinar</u> to provide information on the ERO Enterprise's approach to collecting, maintaining, and securing registered entity evidence and CMEP documentation as well as project enhancements addressing <u>issues related to collection and securing of data and evidence</u>. More than 765 stakeholders attended the meeting, demonstrating industry's engagement and interest in the project.

NEW Save the Date for GridSecCon 2020

NERC's Electricity Information Sharing and Analysis Center (E-ISAC) and the Texas Reliability Entity (Texas RE) are planning the tenth annual grid security conference for October 20–23 in Houston, Texas.

The conference brings together cyber and physical security experts from industry and government to share emerging security trends, policy advancements, and lessons learned related to the electricity industry. Participants can look forward to four days of training, engaging speakers, briefings, and local security-focused tours. NEW Volunteer Request for Failure Modes and Mechanisms Task Force

The Failure Modes and Mechanisms Task Force (FFMTF) analyzes the common types of BES substation equipment listed in the <u>Addendum for Events with Failed Station Equipment</u> and their failures to determine their failure modes and mechanisms (FMM), FMM trends and patterns, and improves BES reliability by providing information useful for reducing station equipment failures.

The FFMTF needs volunteers from registered entities and industry experienced in substation equipment subject areas such as:

- Substation Design & Equipment Selection
- Construction & Installation
- Testing
- Operation
- Condition Monitoring



- Corrective Maintenance & Repair
- Failure Investigation
- Obsolescence management & Replacement Selection

If you are new to equipment FMM, see the <u>FMM introductory video</u>. Regional Event Analysis groups may provide current EAS-approved FMM diagrams to registered entities as needed.
