Registered Ballot Body (RBB) members and others interested in NERC Reliability Standards are encouraged to submit nominations for industry segment representatives on the SC. Reliability Standards are mandatory for all bulk power system owners, operators, and users in North America, and the SC's oversight role is therefore increasingly important. The SC consists of two members from each of the ten Industry Segments that make up the RBB. In addition, Appendix 3B of the Rules of Procedure contains special provisions to be used to achieve a balance of representation



between the United States and Canada. The SC is elected by industry stakeholders and reports directly to the NERC Board of Trustees. The SC meets up to twelve times each year with meetings usually being held virtually. The <u>SC Charter</u> provides a description of the SC's responsibilities. Anyone may submit a nomination. To be eligible for nomination, a nominee shall be an employee or agent of an entity belonging in the applicable Segment. To allow verification of affiliation, a nominee must be a registered user in the NERC <u>RBB</u>. It is not required that the nominee be the same person as the entity's RBB representative for the applicable Segment. Instructions are provided in the <u>Election of Members of the NERC Standards Committee Procedure</u> and nomination forms are posted on the <u>Standards Committee Election web page</u>. To submit a nomination, complete the nomination form and submit to <u>Katrina Blackley</u> no later than **August 17, 2020.** Once received, nominations will be posted on the SC's Nominations and Election web page. The special election will be conducted **August 26–September 4, 2020.** Election results will be announced shortly after the election closes.

## **NEW Project 2019-03 – Cyber Security Supply Chain Risks Redline Approved**

The CIP-005-7 redline to last approved standard (i.e., CIP-005-6) has been added to the Draft 3 posting section of the <u>project page</u>. This redline will allow industry to view the proposed modifications compared to the last approved standard.

## **NEW FERC, NERC Publish Guide to Identify Supply Chain Vendors**

FERC and NERC took a further step to protect the nation's electric infrastructure by publishing a <u>joint white paper</u> to help the electric sector identify vendors of components on their networks so that they can take any necessary action to mitigate potential risks to the bulk power system.

The electric sector relies on networking and telecommunications equipment to operate the bulk power system. This white paper identifies several noninvasive techniques that security professionals may use to identify vendors of a well-known and often-targeted component known as a network interface controller (NIC).
