NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL OF MOTION TO INTERVENE AND REQUEST FOR REVIEW AND TEMPORARY STAY OF THE NOTICE OF PENALTY FILED BY NERC, AND MOTION FOR WAIVER

On January 19, 2011, the Unidentified Registered Entity ("URE") submitted a Motion to Intervene and Request for Review and Temporary Stay of the Notice of Penalty Filed by NERC ("January 19 Filing") in the above-captioned proceeding. The URE hereby provides notice to the Commission that it withdraws the January 19 Filing.

Furthermore, the URE respectfully requests that the Commission waive Rule 216(b) of its Rules of Practice and Procedure, and permit this withdrawal to become effective as of January 21, 2011. The Commission has made clear that waiver of the 15-day period specified under Rule 216(b) is warranted where there is good cause for doing so. The URE submits that good cause exists here; waiver will permit the Notice of Penalty in the above-captioned proceeding to take effect in a timely manner, and avoid a potentially protracted proceeding.

Accordingly, the Commission should waive the 15-day period specified under Rule 216(b), and permit the notice of withdrawal to take effect today. Finally, to the extent that the Commission
